



Revised SAT Concept Alignment Charts

The purpose of this document is to detail how the concept categories within Method Test Prep's New SAT program align with those set forth by the College Board for the Revised SAT. The first of the charts comprises all of our Mathematics concepts, indicating which ones align with the College Board's three Mathematics subscore categories: Heart of Algebra, Problem Solving and Data Analysis, and Passport to Advanced Math. The second of the charts comprises all of our Evidence-Based Reading and Writing & Language concepts, indicating which ones align with the College Board's four Evidence-Based Reading and Writing subscore categories: Command of Evidence, Words in Context, Expression of Ideas, and Standard English Conventions.

Educators can use these charts to better understand which questions and concepts to assign to students who need work in specific content areas as evidenced by the PSAT and SAT score report subscores.
